We have new grass in the center taxiway, along with a newly lengthened concrete startup pad for the larger airplanes. This was done so the ground would not be stripped when those large engines are run up prior to flight. I would also remind those of you that run smoke not to do so while on the ground, this kills the grass immediately.

Also, channels 23, 24, 53, 54, 39 and 40 are restricted frequencies. This is pretty simple; DO NOT FLY on those! The pins have been removed, the bolts have been removed from the frequency board and notations placed prohibiting their use. Just prior to the removal of the bolts, someone was still using the channels. Please, if you notice someone flying on one of these channels, ask them to stop. If you meet with any resistance, let me know and I will be glad to handle it. Nuff said.

The flying season is here! Of course, lately most all you can fly is a kite with steel leader for line. It has been rather windy. The big-bird was blown away last weekend. We will see about a re-scheduling of the event.

Don't forget that June 3rd, this Saturday, is the Fun Scale Contest at the field. I think we will also be allowing a Scale fly-in to take place at the same time. Come out and compete with all those scale planes I see all the time. You could also

use it as a tune-up contest for the Scale Masters Qualifier Open class the next weekend at Thunderbirds. That class will give away an 8 channel radio to the first place winner!

Another thing to remember is that on July 8th we will have a Club Picnic and Fun Fly! This one is **FREE** to all GSW members and their family members. That is correct; no landing fees, no lunch fee, just come to play, eat, and have fun with the family at the field. Safety Issues Continued

Please notice that we now have just six flight stations. Three of the flight stations were removed on the south end of the flight line. This serves a twofold purpose. One, to try and keep members from flying over Randol Mill Road. Second, to keep everyone close enough to hear activity calls of other pilots, at the flight line, who are taking off, landing, doing touch and goes, dead stick, and on the field, etc. **Communication between pilots is imperative for flight line safety.** The old saying, "The right hand needs to know what the left hand is doing" applies at the flight line.

Frequency control is another important aspect of safe flying. Lots of RC clubs have a daily impound area. At GSW frequency control is on the members honor system. Get in the habit of putting your card up on the frequency board and obtain the frequency pin before you ever touch your transmitter. Just as important, is making sure that your transmitter is turned off when you return the frequency pin to the board or hand it to another member with whom you are sharing the frequency. Remember that good safety habits are just as easy to develop as are bad safety habits. Bad frequency habits can be very dangerous. It's better to be safe that sorry.

Remember to always keep **SAFETY FIRST** and safe flying until next month.
