A: They are the only ones who have the time.

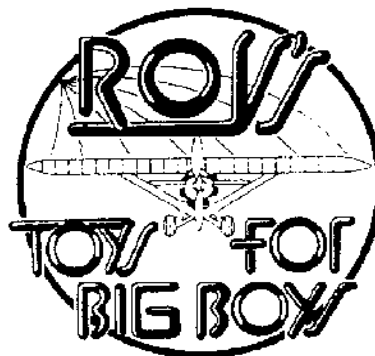

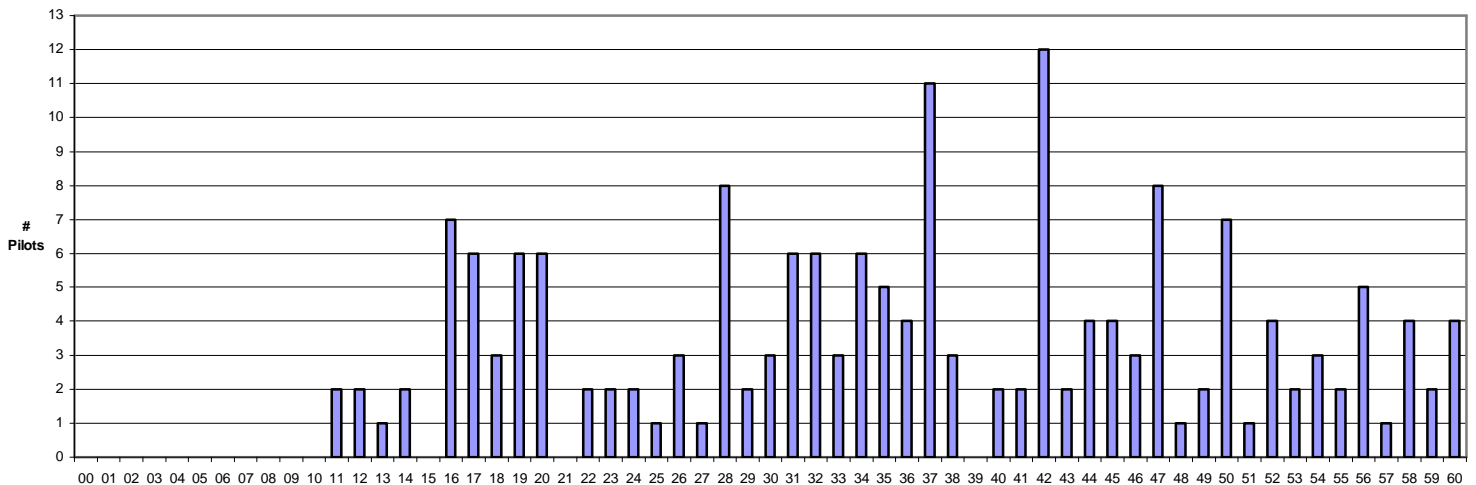
