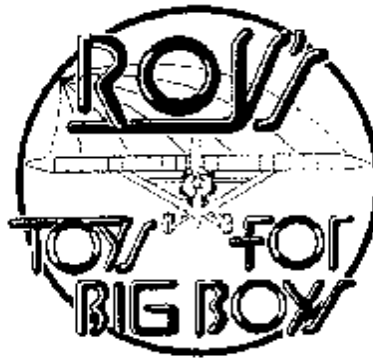

David Horton and Frank Rowell fixed the startup station by the runway. They raised the back of the stand so planes would not roll away from the stand and get a propeller into the starter's hand. A total of \$19.00 was spent on supplies.

A safety issue was raised that had come to the attention of the officers and some of the members. One of the members was flying 3-D, standing by the east edge of the runway very close to the airplane that was hovering just above the ground. It was pointed out that

club rules require pilots to be standing in a pilot's station on the west side of the fence to fly. Discussion was had on the subject of 3-D flying and safety. Some members felt there should be no 3-D flying, others felt there are members that abide by the club's rules and should not be penalized for one person. A motion was seconded and passed to send the member a letter explaining that any further infractions would be the cause of removal from the club.

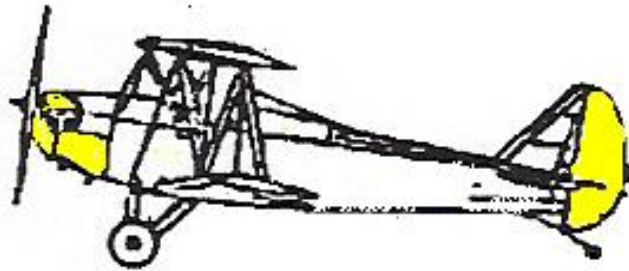

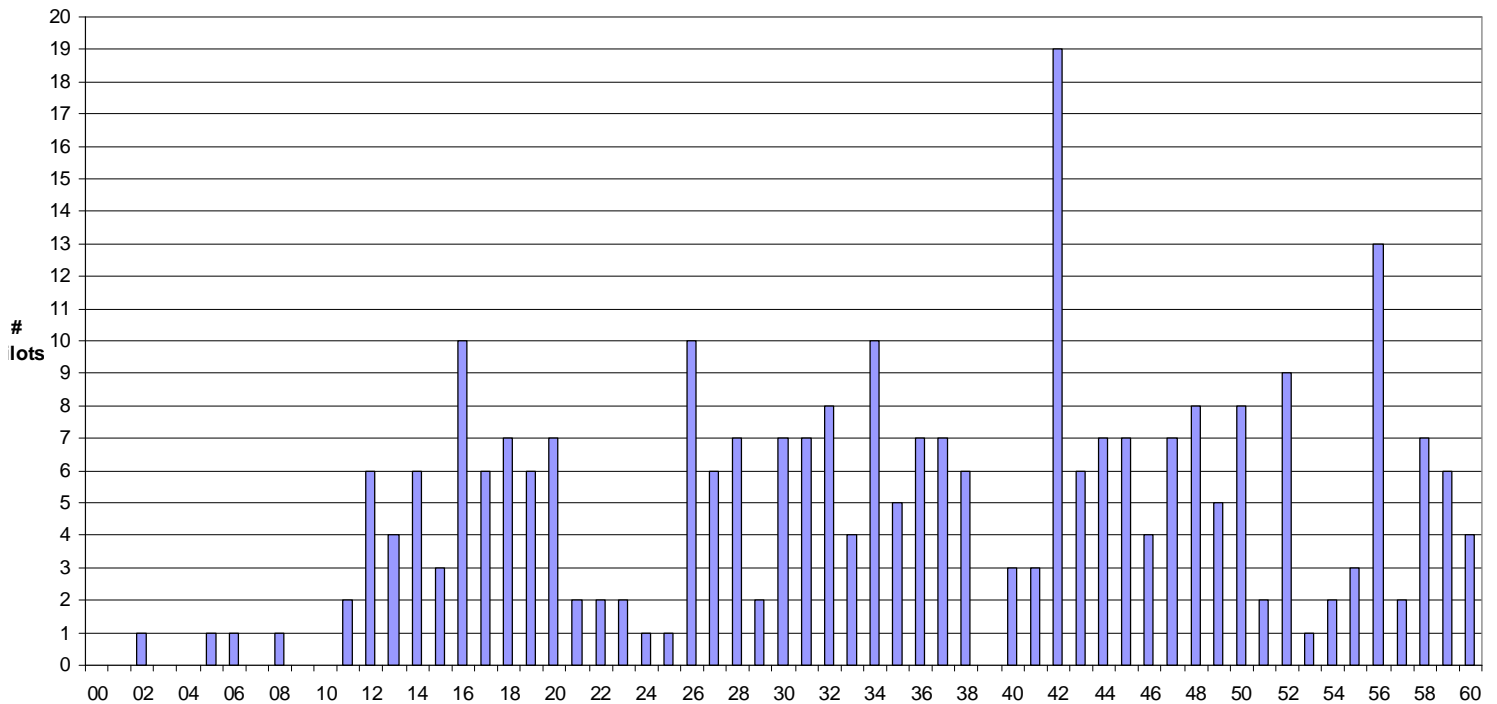
