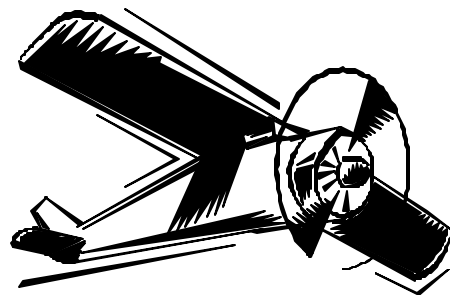

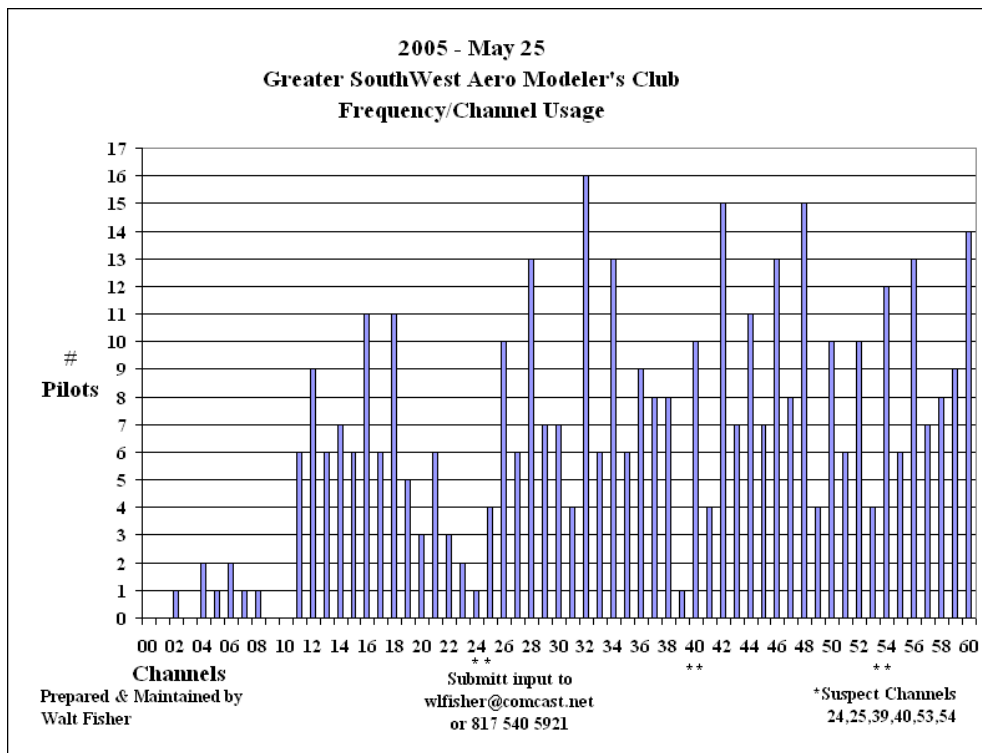

Proposed Revisions to GSWAM By-Laws by Walt Fisher

Here is a summary of the revision of the club's By-Laws and the logic behind the revision. The objective is to clarify and not to change them. Although there will be some who will argue that point. Clarity and to updated the By-Laws as the club's needs change is the whole objective.

1. *ADDED* a Glossary of Terms.
2. ARTICLE 1 NAME, *ADDED* GSWAM
3. ARTICLE 2 PURPOSE, *Reworded, no difference in content.*
4. ARTICLE 3 MEMBERSHIP A: QUALIFICATIONS, *Reworded because the glossary of terms explains all that.*
5. ARTICLE 3 B DUES, *Reworded the NEW MEMBER dues because the glossary of terms state that a New Member is one who was not a member in good standing with the club the previous year. Current By-Laws state a new member is one joining the **first time** is a New Member. Which means one could have joined the club in 1999 and left the club until 2005 and **NOT** be considered a New Member and **NOT** have to pay the initiation fee of \$20. Using current By-Laws I wonder how many members are really in the club, keeping in mind the club was established in 1972, maybe thousands. Now I understand why often I hear we are the largest club in Texas. The next change is renaming the Junior Membership to YOUTH Membership. This is done because of a similar membership called Junior Member and the two memberships will be confusing. I also include the fees and dues for a Youth Membership. Next I incorporated something the club approved months ago about Family Members of our membership. Family members need not be living in the same household. See glossary of*
6. *terms for family member. I also include something else approved by the membership that being for the officers who serve a full term, 12 months, dues are waived for the next year. I omitted the deposit of \$15 of each members dues being placed into a club savings account for maintenance and acquisition of a flying site. Because it was not being done when the current officers took office and I see no need to have this requirement in the By-Laws. I aligned the percentage required to make special assessments or to increase dues and the percentage required to pass amendments to the By-Laws to where they are the same. They were 75% and 2/3 respectively I changed both to the same, 2/3 of a majority vote. I ADDED the possibility that someday the club might have an emeritus, honorary, member and what the dues/fees are. See the glossary of terms.*
6. ARTICLE 4 BOARD OF DIRECTORS A. Officers and Duties...1. President.. *Appointed the president spokesperson to the media for the club.* 2. Vice-President...*ADDED is responsible for procuring Name Badges.* 3. Secretary...*Included among the secretary duties the following was ADDED: Coordinates with and processes correspondence between GSWAM and AMA, maintains the By-Laws, Constitution, Field Regulations by incorporating any and all changes.* 4. Treasurer... *Omitted the requirement to provide a general accounting of all expenditures because it has not been done in the past. I did make provisions for members to look at the financial records when desired.* 5. Newsletter Editor... *same.* B. TERM OF OFFICE...*Realigned the term of office to where it is on a calendar year basis rather than 12 months after elected. ADDED..Nominations take place in October. ADDED.. Primarily Elections are in November with paper ballots.* C. Special Elections. *ADDED..Special Elections are done using paper ballots.* D. QUORUM... *same.*
7. ARTICLE 5 MEETINGS... *ADDED.. A reasonable effort will be made to notify members of a Special Meeting, the time, place and agenda plus the minutes should be recorded and provided to the membership. Roberts Rules of Order are applicable at the meetings.*
8. ARTICLE 6 COMMITTEES... *ADDED an expiration date to committees and appointments plus a timeframe for new President to appoint new committees or appointments. OMITTED... officers as standing members of all committees.*
9. ARTICLE 7 FLYING FIELD... *Same*
10. ARTICLE 8 AMENDMENTS... *I thought this was wordy so it was reworded but still says the same thing.*
11. ARTICLE 9 GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE... *Retitled this article to Violation Discipline Procedures. Required the individual if expelled to surrender the club card and key. The following calendar year if the member rejoins the club it will be done as a New Member (not in good standing) and must pay New Member dues/fees.*

NOTE: There is not an increase in our club dues but I would like to see a dues increase. One fee, \$80-\$100 annually, for everything (membership, gate key and name badge) for members in good standing with the club. New members same fees as above, but prorated on a quarterly basis with NO INITIATION FEE. Youth and Senior Citizens would pay one half that amount.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

CLUB MEMBER: Shall be an individual in good standing with AMA and the club.

DUES: Membership fees charged to individuals of good standing with AMA to join the club.

EMERITUS MEMBER: An honorary and permanent title granted by the President to a non dues paying member with no gate key and no flying or voting privileges.

FAMILY MEMBER: (1) Spouse of a senior member in good standing (2) children of a senior member in good standing by birth or adoption under the age of 18.

FEE: Payment required for membership, goods, services, benefits, and privileges.

GOOD STANDING: Shall be a current AMA member who is current in all GSWAM dues and fees.

INITIATION FEE: A fee assessed to anyone joining the club who was not a member in good standing the previous year.

JUNIOR MEMBER: Shall be a member under the age of 18.

NEW MEMBER: Shall be an AMA member joining the club who was not a member in good standing with the club the previous year.

ODA: Other Duties Assigned.

REJOIN: The act of joining the club after a period of absence of 1 year shall be considered a New Member and must pay appropriate fee/dues.

RENEWAL: The act of renewing one's current good standing status with the club.

SAB: Same As Above.

SENIOR CITIZEN: Shall be 62 years old as of 1 January.

SENIOR MEMBER: Shall be an AMA member and a club member 18 or older.

QUORUM: (1) 50% of members in good standing (2) 15 members in good standing.

YOUTH MEMBERSHIP: Shall be a one calendar year temporary status granted to a minor under the age of 16 who is an AMA member, and is a non GSWAM family member. No voting privileges. The following calendar year the individual shall be considered a New Member and shall pay initiation dues and fees.

ARTICLE 1 NAME: The name of this club is GREATER SOUTHWEST AERO MODELERS (GSWAM) Fort Worth Texas and may be referred herein as "the club".

ARTICLE 2: PURPOSE: GSWAM's purpose is to aid, assist, and encourage building and flying of model aircraft.

ARTICLE 3: MEMBERSHIP:

A. Qualifications: A member shall be in good standing with Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA). Shall pay appropriate dues as set forth in paragraph 3B.

B. Dues: Dues are non refundable and include a gate key. Dues must be paid NLT 31 January. Dues are as follows:

(1) New Member \$20 initiation fee, \$61 annual dues (annual dues are prorated at \$5 per month, a

partial month is considered a whole month).

(2) Renewing senior member, \$61 annually regardless renewal date.

(3) Senior citizen, one half of the required annual dues.

(4) Family Member, \$1 gate key fee if needed

(5) Junior Member, \$61 annual dues.

(6) Youth Membership, \$2 annual fee (not prorated).

(7) Officers, dues are waived the year following a full term (12 months) in office.

(8) Emeritus Member, shall be permanently designated by the President with dues waived.

NOTE: Dues may be changed by 2/3 approval of a quorum.

ARTICLE 4: BOARD OF DIRECTORS (BOD)

A. OFFICERS and DUTIES

(1) PRESIDENT shall be the chairperson at all meetings of GSWAM when possible. Shall be the spokesperson to the media in all matters pertaining to the club.

(2) VICE PRESIDENT shall act in the same capacity as the President when the President is absent. Shall be responsible for field maintenance and safety. Will procure Name Badges as requested. ODA by the President.

(3) SECRETARY shall do the following: Record the minutes of all business meetings, maintain current club roster, announce scheduled and special business meetings, coordinate with and process correspondence between GSWAM and AMA as necessary to satisfy AMA administrative requirements, maintains the Constitution, the By-Laws, the Field Regulations, by incorporating any and all approved changes to said documents in a timely fashion, provides membership applications, cards, and gate keys to the hobby shops processing our membership applications, orchestrates the changing of the gate locks on 31 January and obtaining necessary keys to support our membership. ODA assigned by the President.

(4) TREASURER shall collect all money due to GSWAM (dues, fees, special assessments, donations, contest entry fees, auctions, raffles, etc). Shall pay all club debts and maintain accurate record of money received and disbursed. Shall make financial records available for all members' perusal when requested. ODA by the president.

(5) NEWSLETTER EDITOR shall assemble, edit, print, and mail the club's newsletter so all members receive the newsletter prior to the next scheduled business meeting. ODA by the president.

C. Term of Office: Term of office shall expire at the end of the calendar year.

D. Nominations for Office: Nominations for Office shall be made in October.

E. Primary Elections: Primary Elections shall be in November using a paper ballot.

F. Special Elections: Shall be held to fill a vacated office as necessary using a paper ballot.

G. Quorum: Shall be 50% of the members in good standing or 15 such members whichever is lesser.

ARTICLE 5: MEETINGS shall be on the 2nd Tuesday at 7PM monthly at a place to be determined by the membership. Special meetings may be called by the President or 50% of the membership. A reasonable effort shall be made to notify all members of the meeting NLT 3 days prior to the meeting. Notification shall include date, place, time, and agenda. When possible the president shall preside over all meetings. Minutes shall be recorded and published so all members are aware of the

meeting's out come. Robert's Rules of Order shall apply during all GSWAM meetings.

ARTICLE 6: FLYING FIELD is open to all members in good standing. Field Regulations must be followed. Pilots operating a transmitter on an Amateur Radio frequency must hold a valid FCC Amateur Radio Operator License. An expenditure for field maintenance in excess of \$300 must be approved by 2 club officers.

ARTICLE 7: COMMITTEES shall be appointed by the President. They may be for a special project and terminate upon completion, or they may be for a period of time. All appointments shall expire at the end of the calendar year. The new President shall reappoint/reaffirm all committees/appointments by or during February's business meeting.

ARTICLE 8: AMENDMENTS to the By-Laws requires 2/3 approval of a quorum. A reasonable effort shall be made to notify all members of the proposed amendment(s) NLT 3 days prior to the day the amendment will be considered for a vote.

ARTICLE 9: VIOLATION DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES

1st Violation: 3 witnessing members sign the violation form listing Field Regulation violation and ask violator to *sign the form. Give the form to an officer.

2nd Violation: SAB plus a one month suspension of field privileges imposed by the President.

3rd Violation: SAB plus member is suspended by the President until next meeting when, if present, the individual may argue his case to the membership. Ultimate disposition will be determined by a majority vote of a quorum. If expelled the individual must surrender club card and gate key. The individual may rejoin the club 1 January as a New Member and shall pay appropriate dues/fees.

*If individual refuses to sign form make necessary notation and a copy of the form will be mailed to the person.
