President's Corner

We have been very lucky the past month. There have been several instances of storms closing in and around the field, but no damage has been done! Hallelujah!

The new meeting place seemed to be just fine. We have access from the outside directly into the building. I know several folks had mentioned that it was hard to bring aircraft for Model of the Month. Now, just park next to the door and walk inside! We had several members at the meeting and most everyone ate while there. Part of your meal ticket goes toward our Toys for Tots at the end of the year. McDonald's will give us a check to Toys for Tots, up to \$500.00, from a percentage of your buying food when coming to the meeting. Oh, and free refills while there is pretty good, too.....

A couple of business items were covered in the meeting. The first is the adoption of a noise abatement system for the field. I have included the newest field rules for the noise ordinance at the field. I don't think you will find it too restrictive, but some of our models will have to go through some modifications to fit. The vote to accept the IMAC sound guidelines was unanimous and will go into effect June 1, 2008. I think I have a couple of planes myself that will have to have different mufflers setups. This is not a bad thing, just the responsible thing. There have been a few planes I figured would not pass the test that passed with flying colors! I think the biggest surprise were the planes that passed the test on the ground, but when the prop unloaded in the air, the sound was greater than would be allowed. We will have to get

bigger props or more pitch to control those issues. A copy of the rules is included in this newsletter.

Second order of business was more to do with the By-laws. A question was asked about Grandchildren being part of the Family Membership. Seeing as how grandchildren was not a listed affiliation, a clarification was requested, or some of our grandparents were going to have to get a membership for the grandkids....Discussion was started and the members in attendance felt we are in the hobby and should attempt to get children involved in this hobby every chance we get. So, a quick draft was made to include not only grandchildren into the Family Membership area, but to also include your nieces, nephews, kid next door or down the block. In short, any youth under the age of 18 that you will be responsible for at the field can be a Family Member. It does mean you have to be at the field when that kid flies, and he has to be an AMA member. The Secretary will develop special membership cards for easy identification of Family Members. The proposed change is also included in the newsletter.

If you would like to have a copy of the Bylaws to have and hold, please let me know and I will be most glad to send you a copy. Sonny is also going to have them on the website as soon as I get him a copy of them.

I am looking forward to seeing you at the meeting! Hopefully I will see you at the field!

Old Business:

Noise Abatement Ruling: The attending club members voted to adopt the International Miniature Aircraft Association's (IMAA) sound control program as recommended by the AMA, and will take effect June 1, 2008. A transition period will be in effect immediately, and aircraft will be randomly spot checked as time permits. Sound rules will be posted in both the club newsletter and web site.

Club Operating Budget: The attending club members voted unanimously to accept the proposed club budget developed by the Budget Committee.

Field Plastic Chair Replacements: Attending members approved the replacement of the older chairs with the heavier built brown plastic chairs.

New Business:

Greater Southwest Aero Club Sound Rules

The City of Fort Worth is requiring the club to have and enforce a sound control program as a condition of our lease. The AMA recommends the program developed by the International Miniature Aerobatic Club (IMAC).

All models flown at the GSWA Field will comply with these rules.

The sound level will be measured over Grass with a maximum sound level of 96 DB using a Radio Shack sound meter set on slow response and using the A scale. Any other meter will need to be calibrated against one of the club meters before it can be used.

The measurement will be made at a distance of 25 feet downwind from the spinner centerline. The meter will be at a height of 24 inches above the ground. The meter will be held parallel to the propeller and 1-2 feet behind the propeller disc in the interest of safety. Proper and secure restraint of the model must be performed during the test and all spectators must be well behind the model.

Passing this test is not the "end all" for sound requirements and evaluations. Some propellers that generate loud prop noise during dives and high speed passes are also not allowed. Any individual model that generates sound levels that are in excess of that generated by other models that have passed the DB testing will not be allowed. Testing of sound levels from the flight line with the meter aimed at the model will be done from time to time.

Sound levels can be controlled by using

larger props to limit the engine RPM as well as mufflers that have larger volumes and smaller exit openings.

The field is for the enjoyment of the entire club and as a result is the responsibility of the entire club in participating in the control of sound levels. We have a very nice facility and don't want to lose it because of a few individuals that think they are above the rules. LOUD is not good.

Proposed change to Family Member

FAMILY MEMBER: (1) Spouse of a senior member in good standing (2) children of a senior member in good standing by birth or adoption under the age of 18.

FAMILY MEMBER: (1) Spouse of a senior member in good standing (2) children under the age of 18 that are affiliated with a Senior member in good standing. As a flying member, the Family Member must be an AMA member. The club Secretary will develop a readily identifiable membership card for Family Members. The sponsoring member must be present when the Family Member flies at club facilities.

Texas Scale Championships-Scale Masters Qualifier

Only one month to go to the biggest, longest running and ONLY scale contest in Texas or the surrounding 6 states. Don't miss it.

The TEXAS SCALE CHAMPIONSHIP/SCALE MASTERS QUALIFIER. Hosted by the Fort Worth Thunderbirds. It will be held on May 31-June 1, 2007.

Last month I talked about the OPEN and FUN scale classes. Those two classes would cover ANY plane you have ever seen at our field. They are considered an entry-level class for new and developing scale competitors who want to get their feet wet without all the hassle of building a fully loaded scale plane, ARF's are allowed and encouraged or you could fly a plane you bought. No Documentation is required, but if you have a three-view drawing it is worth 10 points, color photo or drawing is worth 10 points and craftsmanship 10 points. Little or no documentation required.

Next class up was Advanced. The winner of this event will get an AIRTRONICS R-8000-2.4 RADIO. Documentation is required ONCE AGAIN you can buy or build, ARF's are allowed.

Now for the guys that want to fly with the big boys. EXPERT class. Full blown scale documented planes. Usually this is the more experienced flyers but anyone can enter. In some past contest guys in the Advanced class actually out flew and out build the Experts. Some of the Texas Scale Champions have been in the Advanced class-beating out the Experts.

Like everytime you go to the field you never really know how you will do, a gust of wind, a blown glow plug and you could have a really bad day, or if things go right it could be the best day you ever had.

How does the scoring work—add the Static to the average of your best two flights and you have your score. We will fly minimum of 4 times. For the Texas Champion ALL scores are included-you have to fly all four times to win the Championship. Texas Champion is open to Expert, Advanced, Open and Fun.

Team Scale Class is just what the title says, you can build the plane and have someone else fly it or fly a plane someone else has built. Scale Masters Qualifier---Pilots in Expert, Advanced and Team are automatically entered in the U.S. Scale Masters Qualifier. If you win a position in the Scale Masters you qualify to attend the Championships in Florida later in the year. Don't worry if you win you don't have to attend the Championships—but you do retain the right to brag about it all year.

If you need assistance in getting a plane ready or help on documentation several of us in GSW are ready and eager to help give me a call. If you want to show up at the contest we can help you there also

Come on out, you will see some amazing planes and flying.

AND before you ask-I had NO control over what shirt President Time Lovett was wearing!!!!






